

Ernest Hooper, host of THAT'S ALL I'M SAYING, tackles topics that focus on the opiod crisis, education, music and Florida history. Each week, Rob Lorei hosts FLORIDA THIS WEEK. This moderated discussion provides viewers with informative, lively conversations with an array of some of the area's brightest political analysts.

The summer is always full of great programs to explore as part of the Summer of Adventure. Programs like NO PASSPORT REQUIRED, KINGDOMS OF THE SKY, and WONDERS OF MEXICO ensured that there is plenty to explore on WEDU during the hot summer months. The new series AMANPOUR & COMPANY launched recently and examines the global issues, domestic news and trends impacting the world. FRONTLINE continues to ask the tough questions through in-depth investigative reporting.



WEDU PBS Educational Programming & Services

WEDU has an unwavering commitment to provide quality educational programming for our youngest citizens and prepare children for school. Each week, WEDU provided more than 76 hours of educational programs that inspired children to explore the world around them.

WEDU presents nearly 25 workshops and conference sessions, serving more than 475 educators, families, early learning providers, media-specialists and pre-service teachers enrolled in area colleges each year. Approximately 20 family engagement events provide educational experiences and valuable take-home materials to more than 35,000 children and families.

WEDU PBS Library Corners

WEDU received a very generous bequest from a long-time viewer. The \$4 million gift was the largest gift ever to WEDU. WEDU placed Mrs. Ensign's gift into WEDU's Endowment, which is providing long-term support for WEDU's operating budget.

In recognition of this historic gift, WEDU created the Phyllis L. Ensign Library Corner which are being donated to public libraries throughout WEDU's 16 county veiwing area.

The library corners include a bookshelf with a robust collection of PBS Kids books, DVDs, CDs for the library's lending collection, a reading rug, 2 electronic tablets loaded with PBS apps, 6 turnkey activity sessions with educational materials, a family resource guide, activity sheets, bookmarks, pencils, and more. WEDU also provides the library staff from each location a free training session on Florida PBS LearningMedia, PBS Read-Aloud Program, and PBS Kids Lab.

WEDU PBS Phyllis L. Ensign Library Corners are now open at libraries in Lake Wales, Safety Harbor, North Port, Sarasota, Mulberry, Bradenton and Tampa. WEDU plans to open a minimum of 20 library corners.



WEDU PBS Be More Awards

WEDU created the **WEDU Be More Awards** which is now in its 15th year. The event recognizes and applaudes the outstanding and often unrecognized efforts of West Central Florida's nonprofit organizations, and individuals that support them. More than 500 guests attend the annual community event each year which opens with the Hall of Heroes and is followed by an inspiring luncheon and awards ceremony. WEDU also features each of the winners on-air and online during WEDU's Philanthropy Fridays to raise additional awareness for the services these nonprofits provide in our communities.




