WEDU PBS has broadcast the highest quality programs for more than 58 years. WEDU's on-air programming is the foundation in providing mission driven content that informs, inspires, entertains and enhances the lives of West Central Florida's citizens.

We have produced another year of engaging local programs including Florida This Week, Suncoast Business Forum, Up Close with Cathy Unruh, and WEDU Arts Plus. We also launched a new local series, WEDU Quest, exploring science, technology, and education. We've produced these local programs because we're passionate about the communities of West Central Florida and we believe that you are too!

National programs like Nature, NOVA, Sesame Street, Dinosaur Train, Great Performances, PBS NEWSHOUR and Masterpiece have brought the best in science, education, music, dance, drama, and public affairs to the more than 5 million people WEDU serves.

WEDU offered even more ways to connect with us by bringing these programs to life in the community through outreach events and online services. This past year, even more of our region's teachers explored Florida PBS LearningMedia, an online resource with more than 100,000 PBS educational videos, games, and lesson plans for use in the classroom at no charge to educators. We continued our community outreach with a fourth season of Community Cinema and hosted a collection of special town halls and roundtable discussions around caregiving, education, cancer, and kids and alcohol. WEDU also built strong partnerships with organizations like The Community Foundation of Tampa Bay, which helped raise \$1.75 million for local charities on Give Day and also with the Junior League of Tampa, which resulted in the creation of a new documentary, The Luminaries.

All of these services and content are made possible by donations from viewers – the single largest source of funding for public broadcasting. At the close of this fiscal year, WEDU was honored to announce the receipt of a \$4 million bequest from the estate of Phyllis L. Ensign.

The \$4 million bequest is the largest gift to WEDU in its 58-year history. We are deeply honored by Mrs. Ensign's gift and hope that it will encourage other donors to remember WEDU in their wills. Visionaries, and all of our charitable donors, help ensure that WEDU's quality programming, educational outreach and community events continue to educate,

enlighten, and inspire for many generations to come. We are excited to share with you

the impact this gift has made in the coming years.

WEDU Quest Explores Education & Technology



WEDU launched a new monthly series this year. Host Dr. Shannon McQuaig invites viewers to discover the latest breakthroughs in science, technology and education.

Each episode of WEDU Quest features four local and national segments including one that explores education issues across the entire continuum, from birth through career. The first season included segments on equity in pre-school education, the implementation of technology in the classroom and barriers to achieving a postsecondary education.

The 2015 Luminaries were presented at the inaugural award event on Friday, May 15, 2015.

WEDU PBS Local Productions

Each year, WEDU PBS produces a collection of local programs that include Florida This Week, Suncoast Business Forum, Up Close with Cathy Unruh, WEDU Arts Plus and Florida's Kids and Alcohol Town Hall. WEDU's local programs, documentaries and town halls continued to engage viewers and receive accolades from The National Academy of Television Arts & Sciences, Suncoast Chapter and the Griot Drum Awards.

WEDU was honored on November 13, 2014 by The Tampa Bay Association of Black Journalists during the Griot Drum Awards. *Robert Butler: Original Highwayman Artist*, a segment of WEDU Arts Plus, accepted the award for "Community/Public Affairs Segment." The annual ceremony recognizes print, broadcast, and online media professionals for quality coverage of people of color in the Tampa Bay area.

During a special edition of *Up Close with Cathy Unruh*, WEDU explored the struggles and resources of caregivers in Tampa Bay with a roundtable discussion. Local experts highlighted the latest considerations of baby boomers and their parents, aiming to provide solutions based on best practices. The program helped to direct viewers to caregiving resources in the community.

Community and education leaders from across Tampa Bay sat down for a special discussion on the state of Tampa Bay's local schools. The special episode of *Florida This Week* broadcast in September 2015.

WEDU's Florida's Kids and Alcohol Town Hall Meeting renewed a commitment to continue the conversation about underage drinking and drug use. Moderator Laura McElroy led a panel of adults and teens to discuss strategies to keep teens safe.

WEDU PBS National Programs

WEDU leveraged PBS national programs encouraging viewers to explore new ideas and broaden personal horizons with content that showcased education, arts, culture, science, nature, news and public affairs locally and around the world.

New York Times reporter Nicholas Kristoff, Ashley Judd, Blake Lively and Malin Ackerman met activists fighting sex trafficking in the U.S. in *A Path Appears*. WEDU supplemented the three-part series about activists fighting gender oppression with a series of community outreach events and a repeat broadcast of WEDU's original documentary *Too Close To Home, Human Trafficking in Tampa Bay*.

In March, a three-part film from Ken Burns told the comprehensive story of cancer from its first description in an ancient Egyptian scroll to the gleaming laboratories of modern research institutions. *CANCER: The Emperor of All Maladies*, a six-hour film, combined a sweeping historical narrative with intimate stories. WEDU continued the conversation with a full night of programming that included a special *Up Close with Cathy Unruh*, *WEDU Arts Plus*, and premiere of *Kids Rock Cancer*.

April introduced a new documentary from Rory Kennedy. *Last Days in Vietnam* featured the chaotic final days of the Vietnam War. As the North Vietnamese Army closed in on Saigon, the South Vietnamese resistance crumbled.

Viewer favorite *PBS Newshour* continued to keep viewers informed, and topics viewers wanted to know more about were featured as *Frontline* explored *Secrets, Politics and Torture; Outbreak;* and *The Trouble with Chicken*.

For three nights in August, *BIG BLUE LIVE* presented the first live nature program centering around the extraordinary annual confluence of marine life in and around Monterey Bay, California. One of the largest ever for a natural history program, WEDU also hosted a community event that was followed by discussion with local marine experts.

September kicked off with a new Masterpiece series, *Indian Summers*. Julie Walters starred as the glamorous doyenne of an English social club in the twilight era of British rule in India. Set in a subtropical paradise, the nine-part series explored the collision of the high-living English ruling class with the local people agitating for Indian independence.

WEDU PBS Downton Abbey

In January, WEDU PBS kicked off season 5 of *Downton Abbey. The Emmy®* and Golden Globe® award-winning hit drama returned for a fifth season of intimately interlaced stories centered around an English country estate – an entertaining formula that has made "Downton Abbey" the highest-rated drama in PBS history.

WEDU marked the return of the international hit with a series of previews and themed events. Events kicked off at the historic Palladium Theatre in St. Petersburg with a themed reception and preview screening event. More than 400 guests filled the theatre. Along with the advance screening of the season premiere, guests were able to pose in front of Highclere Castle, known to fans as "Downton Abbey."

The next stops on the Downton Abbey screening tour included the historic Tampa Theatre and Sarasota Opera House. The evenings opened with a themed reception, digital photo booth and live music from Late Night Brass.

Our final stops included the Polk Theatre in Lakeland and Hernando Pasco State College in Wesley Chapel. Each event hosted a variety of themed activities from live music, costume contests, photo booths, and more.

WEDU PBS Educational Programming & Services

WEDU continued an unwavering commitment to provide quality educational programming for our youngest citizens and prepare children for school.

WEDU had another successful year in children's programming and is serving more and more children in West Central Florida with the most rigorously researched educational content available. Each week, WEDU provided more than 76.5 hours of educational programs that inspired children to explore the world around them.

WEDU offered families content not only on-air, but also online, on mobile devices and on the ground to help kids build critical skills. Increasingly, WEDU is serving West Central Florida children wherever they live, learn, and play through educational and engaging PBS content.

Children participating in the United Way Suncoast's Reading Pals program celebrated the 100th Day of School in February 2015 at the Nick Capitano Boys & Girls Club in Tampa. The event was coordinated by WEDU and the United Way Suncoast. As a part of the event, students visited a variety of learning stations featuring math and reading activities with a 100th day of school theme.

WEDU provided special character appearances throughout the year. Every other month, children were able to learn and interact with their favorite PBS Kids' character at the Glazer Children's Museum. The Cat in the Hat, Clifford, Sid the Science Kid, and others made appearances.

WEDU helped celebrate Sarasota County Public Schools "Embracing Dr. Seuss' Differences Day" as part of Read Across America, an annual celebration of the birthday of Dr. Seuss. The all-day event was created in partnership with the Sarasota nonprofit Embracing Our Differences. More than 120 volunteers, including WEDU staff, read books aloud to elementary school classrooms throughout the county to help promote the importance and fun of reading.

In April 2015, more than 3,400 children and families attended the 6th Annual Storybook Forest event at Crews Lake Wilderness Park in Spring Hill. The free literacy event, hosted by the Early Learning Coalition of Pasco and Hernando Counties, and sponsored by WEDU, included exhibits and activities focused on storybook themes.

WEDU also offered online resources by providing the **PBS Kids, PBS Parents** and **Florida PBS LearningMedia** websites with more than 100,000 resources for parents, caregivers and teachers to help children build critical skills. WEDU PBS announced that Bobbi Starling of Woodland Elementary School in Dade City was selected to serve as a 2015 Lead PBS LearningMedia Digital Innovator.

Florida PBS Learning Media is an award-winning digital media service that provides direct access to more than 100,000 classroom ready, curriculum-targeted resources for PreK-12 educators. Florida PBS LearningMedia builds on the strength of public media and is designed to assist teacher effectiveness and student achievement.

Bobbi teaches fourth and fifth grade and leads the Robotics and Technology Clubs at her school. She believes digital literacy plays an important role in this mission. Seeing her students focus, engage, question, collaborate, program, create, test, modify and re-design brings her great joy.

The 2015 PBS LearningMedia Digital Innovators program rewarded 100 tech-savvy K-12 educators from across the country. The group received year-long professional development opportunities. In addition, the Lead PBS LearningMedia Innovators, representing the top 30 applicants, received an all-expense-paid trip to Philadelphia to participate in a two-day digital education summit. As a lead innovator, Bobbi represented WEDU at this summit.

WEDU PBS Community Outreach

Throughout the year, WEDU provided a wide variety of outreach activities in West Central Florida, including children's events with character appearances and educational activities, community screenings with engaging discussion, town hall meetings that addressed community needs, candidate debates heading into local and national elections, and more.

WEDU brought PBS programming to life through community outreach events. This year, WEDU launched its fourth season of Community Cinema, a national civic engagement initiative featuring free monthly screenings of films from the Emmy Award-winning PBS series *Independent Lens*.

WEDU addressed youth homelessness with an advance screening of *The Homestretch* followed by a panel discussion. Ernest Hooper, columnist with the Tampa Bay Times, moderated a panel discussion following the film and guests in attendance were able to make an online pledge to help end youth homelessness and take photos in WEDU's social media corner.

WEDU continued its efforts to raise awareness about human trafficking in Tampa Bay with an advance screening of *A Path Appears* held in both Sarasota and Tampa. Following the screening of the film, WEDU held a panel discussion with local experts, human trafficking survivors and law enforcement. Guests were also able to visit booths of local organizations fighting human trafficking. WEDU's original documentary released last year, *Too Close To Home, Human Trafficking in Tampa Bay*, continues to be one of the most-viewed videos on wedu.org.

WEDU PBS Lifelong Learning

WEDU PBS continued to offer opportunities to enrich lives through educational programs for every age.

In partnership with the Community Foundation of Tampa Bay, WEDU hosted the **10th Annual Continuing Education Seminar** for Attorneys, CPAs, CFPs and Trust Officers. The annual seminar helps financial professionals keep up to date on the latest changes in laws affecting tax and estate planning, along with fulfilling requirements for continuing education and professional ethics.

Next Avenue, offered locally by WEDU, is a website for the booming 50+ generation tailored to engage, inspire, and inform the more than 100 million people who are transitioning into what many see as a new life stage – a stage between young adulthood and "old old."

Throughout the year, **WEDU's Speakers Bureau** visited a variety of community organizations and presented talks on a number of topics. WEDU's Speakers Bureau presenters include WEDU Board Members, staff and volunteers.

WEDU PBS Grant Support

WEDU PBS was the proud recipient of a number of grants this past year. Grants fund a variety of mission driven projects and help ensure access to quality WEDU PBS programming.

In October 2014, WEDU was awarded a generous \$100,000 challenge grant from the Newman's Own Foundation, the independent foundation created by the late actor and philanthropist, Paul Newman. The award reflects the ongoing committment of Newman's Own Foundation to support public service and open dialogue. The grant helped bolster the 2015 membership drives and encouraged support from foundations and organizations for WEDU's high quality television programming.

In March 2015, WEDU announced the receipt of two grants. The grants from the William G. and Marie Selby Foundation (\$45,707) and the Joy McCann Foundation (\$25,000) enabled WEDU to participate in a consortium of public television stations to centralize the station's master control broadcast functions into a Network Operations Center (NOC).

The centralization of operations, which is now complete, has improved broadcast quality throughout WEDU's viewing area and reduced ongoing operational expenses. The annual savings made possible by this project have enabled WEDU to better serve the community with expanded productions, increased educational efforts and community outreach programs.

Thanks to a grant from the Rays Community Fund Grant Program, WEDU was able to create two Martha Speaks Reading Buddies traveling kits. The Martha Speaks Reading Buddies program, developed to accompany the PBS series Martha Speaks, is a 10-week, cross-age reading program that provides an innovative way for kindergarten/1st grade students (Little Buddies) paired with 4th/5th grade students (Big Buddies) to increase vocabulary, improve self-esteem, social skills and enhance a love of reading.






